Then share your learning with schools and communities in the UK through a carefully planned and supported education project.



This is no ordinary volunteering opportunity.

We are recruiting for specific volunteer jobs specified by our partners in Tanzania. As part of the programme we are providing a full induction and training course for all participants, a weeks orientation in African Initiatives' UK office and require all volunteers to complete an education project on their return.

After all, once you've seen the world you need to tell people about it.

What's included:

- Full pre-departure support, training and induction
- 1 week's orientation at African Initiatives' Bristol office
- Support in developing a UK education project with an audience chosen by you
- In country accommodation, ground transportation, resident's permit, management/supervision by partners
- National Park fees
- Trips to partner projects and local attractions
- One week's cultural tourism hosted by the Maasai including a trip to the Serengeti.

Volunteering with PWC (The Pastoral Women's Council)

Since 1997 PWC have been working towards long-term community solutions for the poverty and marginalisation of mainly Maasai women and girls. Guided by the principles of solidarity, equality, trust and transparency, they are a female-led community based organisation, made up of the people they work with.

Emanyatta School was entrusted to PWC in 2007 by the traditional leaders who own it on behalf of the community. Since their involvement Emanyatta has become a well respected school and has achieved the best academic results in national examinations in the entire district.
